National Results

This Phi Delta Kappa survey was conducted by landline and cell phone May 4-21, 2017, among a random sample of 1,588 adults, including an oversample of public school parents to a total of 598. Results have a margin of sampling error of 3.5 points for the full sample, including design effects. Error margins are larger for subgroups. The survey was produced for Phi Delta Kappa by Langer Research Associates of New York, N.Y., with sampling, data collection and tabulation by SSRS of Media, Pa.
